**SIXTH ANNUAL LIVING LOCAL EXPO**  
**March 23 at Lawrence High in Lawrence, New Jersey**

The 6th Annual Living Local Expo, organized by Sustainable Lawrence in partnership with the green teams from Lawrence, Ewing Hopewell, and the Mercer County office of Sustainable Development, will feature electric cars, local farms, cooking demonstrations, hands-on workshops, and the "Ask your Neighbor" table where visitors can hear how homeowners completed successful energy-efficient home projects.

The Expo will be held Saturday, March 23, from noon to 4 p.m. in the Commons at Lawrence High School, which is located at 2525 Princeton Pike in Lawrence. The event is free and open to the public. In addition to the more than 40 eco-friendly vendors at the Expo, visitors can hear speakers talk about a variety of sustainability issues ranging from local school gardening and science projects, to the future of transportation, recycling in Mercer County, and more.

Several car dealers will bring their electric models for a mini show in the parking lot. See a converted electric truck and participate in building an electric bicycle using a simple kit.

Sample local produce and restaurant offerings from local farms and chefs. Buy, freshly prepared and delicious lunch and get to know your local farmers at the mini farmer's market.
